

## Friday Night Lights - Youth Worker and Mentor

## 2. JOB PURPOSE

This is an opportunity for a relationships-focussed, proactive and innovative youth worker to support the delivery of a popular Friday evening youth session in Leith. Following consultation with local groups and community police, in early 2023 YMCA Edinburgh partnered with the Community Sports Hub and a network of other voluntary sector organisations to establish Friday Night Lights-a youth group providing diversionary sports activities in a youth work approach. The group reaches young people at a key point in the week and community police have identified the projects impact in reducing levels of anti-social behaviour.

In addition to the group session, we now have capacity to provide additional 1:1 mentoring support to young people attending the group. This flexible support will follow the principles of our well established Plusone and intandem mentoring programmes, but use a paid worker to offer bespoke, timely support to young people identified as a priority in terms of needs.

Core hours of the role are delivering the Friday session (6-9pm) with up to an additional 5 hours available to provide 1:1 mentoring. The continued development of the work means that there are likely future opportunities for additional work for those interested.

## 3. MAJOR TASKS & DUTIES TYPICALLY INCLUDE:

- 1. Supporting the delivery of a weekly group session to young people.
- 2. Building relationships with young people to provide a welcoming and safe atmosphere.
- 3. Supervising young people participating in our activities.
- 4. Contribute to monitoring and evaluation processes of the service.
- 5. Working as part of a youth work team, supporting and communicating clearly with colleagues from a variety of organisations and disciplines.
- 6. Effective representation of YMCA Edinburgh and their programmes to professional partners and community organisations.
- 7. 1:1 mentoring support to young people, in agreement with line manager.
- 8. Acting as a role model to young people.
- 9. Where possible involvement in planning and partnership meetings around the project and it's development.
- 10. Following YMCA Edinburgh Policies and Procedures.
- 11. Participating in professional development opportunities.

## 4. PERSON SPECIFICATION

- 1. Experience of working directly with children and young people (ideally in a youth work setting).
- 2. The ability to reflect and feedback on sessions as part of the de-brief process.
- 3. A commitment to working with integrity, as part of a team to best ensure the wellbeing and development of young people.
- 4. An understanding of the issues young people face, including the impact of poverty.
- 5. Confident in communicating clearly with young people and staff/volunteers.
- 6. Good timekeeping and the ability to follow processes and procedures.
